Emmaus Walk

On Friday our Year 12 pupils took part in the Emmaus Walk up Moel Famau. This is one of many Sixth Form charity events, raising money for The Wirral Foodbank.

He explains the purpose of the walk is to enable the students to take some time out of their normal routine and to share each other's story as they complete the walk. This walk is closely linked to the Emmaus walk taken by Christ. After everyone was accounted for, the buses eventually arrived and we set off on our journey. Typically as we approached Wales, the heavens opened and it began to rain. Once off the bus the walk began.
