

SJP Pupils Celebrate another set of Outstanding Results!

Congratulations goes to both our recent 2019 GCSE and A level cohorts, who finish their courses with much to celebrate. Our Progress 8 score of +0.41 for Year 11 puts us as the highest performing comprehensive school on the Wirral, including some of the grammar schools. This measure reflects the stretch and challenge our pupils are subject to at SJP, which has resulted in them, on average, achieving almost half a grade higher at GCSE than their peers with similar starting points nationally. We welcome a large majority of them in to our vibrant Sixth Form as they embark on Level 3 subjects. Our outgoing Year 13 celebrate another year of achieving the grades required for all of their first choice universities or apprenticeships, with exciting prospects awaiting them. We wish them all the very best for the future; they will be sorely missed!

In October, a group of 18 students headed to Shanghai and immediately set out to see the sights, including the Bund with its amazing skyline and architecture before heading to Taicang where we spent three days in our sister school, Taicang No2 Middle School. We were treated to music and art lessons and took part in their Sports' Day, winning at Tug of War and the relay race!

In March, 30 students headed to Beijing. The first stop was the Capital Museum to educate ourselves a little more about the history of China.

Beijing Zoo was our afternoon destination and a highlight was witnessing the pandas there. Day three took us to the Great Wall probably a highlight for all. The afternoon was our flight to Kunming to visit our sister school for the next 3 days. During our 3 day stay, the classroom activities laid on for us were fantastic! Over the next couple of days, we experienced robot making, Mandarin lessons, traditional paper cutting, traditional music playing, calligraphy Chinese writing and some sorry attempts at traditional lotus flower painting!

The trip to our sister school ended with a ceremony, which is very important in China as is the sharing of gifts (a token of respect shown between the visitors and hosts).

Our students gained so much from this experience and learnt an awful lot about themselves as well as a whole new culture.
