Pastoral Care

The College works hard to give our students a smooth, positive transition to secondary school. We work closely with our partner primary schools to get to know your child and to understand their academic and social needs and abilities. This personal and proactive approach ensures that teaching provision is responsive and tailored to the individual.

From the outset, our focus on pastoral care enables staff to forge strong relationships with our new students. At the heart of our pastoral system is the form teacher who supports each student on a daily basis and is a key point of contact for families. The form teachers are supported by a Head of Learning, a Learning Coach, SENDCO, Assistant SENDCO and other key pastoral staff such as the First Aid & Wellbeing Lead. Unique to St John Plessington are the Learning Coaches.

Every child has a Learning Coach who will support them holistically. They will meet with your child during the year to monitor and discuss academic progress as well as ensuring that your child is happy and successful. It is our job to ensure that all children get the chance to show their talents. Our pastoral care system ensures that all the students are known inside out.

St John Plessington is a place where all children can learn.

Enrichment

Our Enrichment Programme, a cornerstone of our Personal Development Curriculum, offers a diverse range of activities designed to foster growth in every student. During lunch and after school, your child will have the chance to explore new passions and cultivate existing interests. Lunch activities, encompass sports, arts, drama, music and more. These activities kindle confidence, facilitate new friendships, and nurture skills. Students will also have the opportunity to participate in a form enrichment programme, which is planned by departments and encourages students to maximise their opportunities outside of the curriculum.

Our commitment extends to subject-specific enrichment too. Small group sessions in subjects provide tailored support, catering to individual learning needs. Enrichment opportunities occur during 4 lunch times, leaving 1 for a year group assembly. Each activity lasts 35 minutes, leaving ample time for a nourishing meal. Students commit to an activity for half a term, with opportunities to switch thereafter.

After-school enrichment is open to all students, with activities in a variety of areas including PE, Performing Arts, Eco, Art, IT and more. Subject enrichment is also available for students in Y10-13, with targeted groups identified for small sessions.

Enrichment isn't just an addendum to the SJP Experience – it's an integral part. Your child won't just learn new skills and expand knowledge; they'll refine their talents, embrace challenges, and shape their character. It's a remarkable way for Year 7 students to transition and make friends, while every student gains opportunities.





Opportunities beyond the Classroom

We also offer numerous exciting opportunities outside the classroom! From exploring local museums to embarking on global adventures, there's something for everyone. Picture yourself on thrilling PGL expeditions, gliding through the Mediterranean on water sports adventures, hitting the slopes in the USA and Europe, or immersing yourself in the rich cultures of China, India, and Peru. Closer to home, students can engage in the National Careers Challenge, enjoy the delights of Cadbury World, and participate in inspiring university visits.

One of our most esteemed programmes is the Duke of Edinburgh's Award, a prestigious endeavour that builds character, leadership, and confidence. Students have the opportunity to embark upon Bronze Award and progress through Silver and Gold Awards.

Our school is brimming with performance and sports opportunities. Students shine on the Gladstone stage in our school productions, while musicians can showcase their talents at HFCMAT's Friday Night Live. Our sports teams compete in many activities with the football teams having been able to play at Prenton Park, home of Tranmere Rovers. With a variety of clubs including STEAM, food, and Eco clubs, there truly is something for everyone!

Spiritual Life

At St John Plessington, all adults model behaviour that is based on Gospel Values. Our mission is to provide a rigorous and broad education within the context of a Christian environment. An understanding of the Roman Catholic faith, in line with the Gospel message, underpins the whole work of the school.

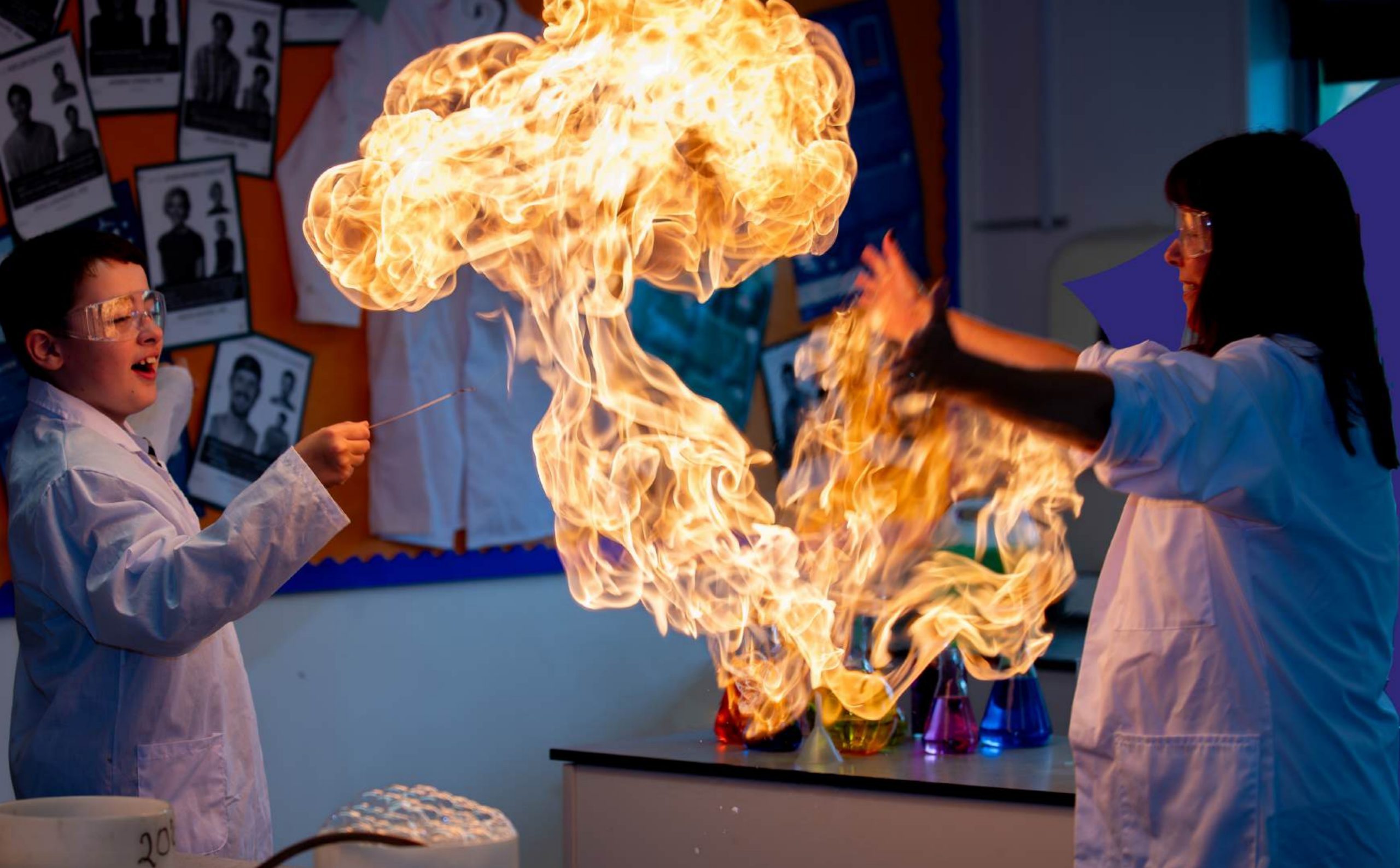
All students study Religious Education and our Catholic identity and spiritual life are reflected in all areas of our College.

Life at our College extends well beyond the classroom.

At St John Plessington, we aim to offer something of lasting value to our students. We call this the 'St John Plessington Experience' - in addition to academic qualifications, the students have opportunities to participate in a range of experiences that are exceptional – for example, visits to the USA, South America, China, Europe and Africa.

The College also partakes in the Duke of Edinburgh's Award initiative with many students currently working towards achieving their Bronze, Silver and Gold Awards.

By empowering an inclusive community, founded on Gospel values, our students are expected to serve others, gain the best qualifications they possibly can and develop a real understanding of who they are in life.

Careers & Post-16 Pathways

Providing high quality careers advice and guidance is part of our role in enabling our students to prepare for life beyond statutory education. We know that if they have a clear and accurate understanding of what 'the world of work' looks like, they are more likely to succeed within it.

We encourage our students to explore the variety of pathways open to them. We empower them, over time, with the knowledge required to make choices that will be the most rewarding and engaging for them. Alongside their curriculum education and working within our personal development framework, our aim is to develop the 'whole' person: to nurture the skills that will allow them to create successful futures, in which they maximise their life opportunities.

We work with many partners in order to deliver our careers programme, which is based upon the Gatsby Benchmarks. These partners include the Careers and Enterprise Company, CareerConnect, Unifrog, training providers and local colleges, universities, employers and employees, to name but a few. In our latest Ofsted report (November 2022) it was noted that **'there is a comprehensive careers programme accessible to all year groups'**.

Recognised for Eco Schools Excellence and Outstanding Conservation Education

Over the past few years we have received two prestigious accolades at SJP.

In 2022 we received our first Eco Schools Green Flag with Merit. We have retained our accreditation this year, gaining the Eco Schools Green Flag with Distinction this time around. This has been down to the joint work of the Eco Ambassadors on our Junior Leadership Team and our extracurricular Eco-Club and SJP Urban Farm Club.

We were also honoured to receive the 2023 Chester Zoo Conservation Schools award for Outstanding Conservation School - Secondary. This is due to having conservation as a key part of the curriculum, with conservation and sustainability messages embedded throughout the school in various projects.

What was particularly significant was that Chester Zoo recognised the importance of pupil voice when presenting us with the award, which they said was;

'In recognition of the work they have done across the school to develop pupil voice, encouraging their young people to speak outwardly and confidently about sustainability issues.'

Sixth Form

We have a broad curriculum offer enhanced by an exciting enrichment programme.

Our students receive highly personalised pastoral support to enable them to be successful in their chosen career.

The Sixth Form Centre provides high spec independent study facilities for our students. There is a large 'open plan' study area with over 70 workstations and Wi-Fi access as well as offices for the Sixth Form Pastoral team. The new build connects with our College Library which our students can access with additional computer facilities available.

The Ann Benson-Burke Study Centre also provides a number of bespoke Sixth Form classrooms including a new Media suite with an additional area for film and media development where students will study in a truly immersive environment, with interactive projectors capable of wirelessly displaying multiple workspaces as well as allowing multiple users to

access a finger touch screen. Photography, SFX and VFX will also be a focus for the students as they utilise the Green Screen Studio with its wall to wall, ChromaKey Cyclorama enabling the students to create work of a professional standard.

College Library

The College boasts a large and vibrant library, valued by the whole community. Sixth Formers are able to work and gain computer access in the College library throughout the day.

The Refectory

Staff and Sixth Formers have the opportunity to come together and share a mutual working and relaxation area near the dining room. It is equipped with Wi-Fi access and staff and students are able to eat and drink in this area.





Safeguarding

As recognised by OFSTED, Leaders ensure there is a strong culture of safeguarding. We take steps to make sure that students are safe. We have created a positive safeguarding ethos here at St John Plessington Catholic College. The wellbeing of our students is a priority. We provide a nurturing environment, where students feel safe to learn, socialise and develop to be the best version of themselves.

At St John Plessington, there is a designated team of safeguarding experts, The Designated Safeguarding Lead is supported by a number of deputy DSLs. All staff are trained above statutory guidance to ensure students receive the best quality care and support.

We support our student's needs through assistance from our experienced pastoral team and external agencies including CAMHS, Kooth, Young Carers and many more.

New Beginnings

Links with Primary Schools

Staff and students from St John Plessington visit local Primary Schools throughout the year for a whole range of liaison activities. Because some of these activities take place at the College, many of our prospective students have visited us on several occasions before they begin Year 7. In the summer term before their admission, all of our new students receive visits from our Transition Team who give them all the help they need to get ready for the move to St John Plessington.

During this time, a whole series of induction events takes place to help newcomers to settle in and to allow parents to get to know the College. A Welcome Evening takes place in July when parents and students meet their new Form Tutors.

Communication with Home

Communication and partnership is key. Parents receive reports twice per academic year and parent teacher meetings throughout the year.

We communicate directly with families via ParentMail and Arbor. All parents have access to our on-line reporting system and extensive Virtual Learning Environment (Google Classroom). These are all accessible via our website at www.stjohnplessington.com, which also contains all of our units of work for all subjects in all years.





Choosing St John Plessington

St John Plessington is a Voluntary Aided school, which means that our Governors are responsible for admissions. They consider applications according to the criteria in our Admissions Policy agreed by the College and the Diocese of Shrewsbury. The Governors consider these applications in a priority order made available to Wirral Local Authority. If you would like to visit the College to discuss the entry of your child, please call us on **0151 645 5049**.

Our planned admission number is **270**, increased by the Governors of St John Plessington in recognition of the growing popularity of the College and the enhanced demand for places.

For any parents who have been unsuccessful with their applications for a place, there is a process of appeals. Parents appeal to an Independent Appeal Panel who may choose to place students over and above the Planned Admission Number of **270**.
