Well done to our pupils for going over and above. You make such a positive contribution to our SJP community and we are very proud of you.






Subject Spotlight


Music Stars

We are incredibly proud of our pupils this year, as always, and have been particularly impressed with the resilience they have shown under such unusual circumstances.

Year 13 A Level groups have completed their NEA coursework by making a music video and accompanying website for their band/artist which has taken extraordinary planning to work around issues including lockdown, tier restrictions and self/peer isolations. We will be able to showcase this work early next year to demonstrate the high level of commitment to the course as well as a deep understanding of the subject that the pupils have shown.

Year 12 have started their Media journeys with the same high level of passion and enthusiasm we have come to expect from pupils at SJP and have already showed incredibly detailed understanding of media

concepts through insightful analyses as well as getting to grips with the filming equipment as they've created their own unique preliminary tasks. We can't wait to continue your learning journey next year!


Their imagination and innovation our astounding!

All Students should adhere to the following guidelines:




HANDS
