Computer Science

During lockdown, the University of Liverpool Maths School offered an online outreach session covering an introduction to computer science taught by Steve Wentworth, Head of Computer Science at ULMaS for our Year 9 students.

The aim of the two hour online session was to introduce students to elements of computing and IT. The topics covered included:

- Inputs, outputs and storage components of a computer system
- Python programming using inputs, outputs and storage using files.

It was an inspiring session covering a wide range of topics that provided students with a real insight into computer science. In particular, the python programming module which gave a practical introduction to Python and how the computer manages the code they write.

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Year 7 Half Term Silent Movie Drama Competition



Drama

This half term, we have been very excited to return to the drama studio and work on our practical performances once again. We have been able to explore many styles and genres and have started to explore our scripted units, it feels great to be back and we are looking forward to many creative times ahead!

As we finish for the Easter break, we would like to recognise and celebrate the work of two year groups in particular: Year 7 and Year 12. We were delighted with the entries we received from the Silent Movie Competition, where students from Year 7 created their own versions of well-known silent movies. Selecting the winners was a very difficult decision and because there were so many


Since returning to the classroom, our students have made an outstanding start to a range of new projects and practical lessons in DT classes.

The Year 11 textiles class has worked hard to create tie dye samples and learn new skills for their GCSE coursework, whilst product design and graphics students have been producing a range of physical and virtual prototypes as proof of concept.

Year 10 product design students have been casting pendants out of pewter and developing their understanding of metals. Y10 graphics students have been manufacturing creative board games and textiles students have been constructing fabric bags and accessories.

Students in Year 8 have been working on a range of projects including Mrs Jones' class who are developing a logo and branding for a new ergonomic bottle.

Our A Level students are approaching the end of their course finishing their final projects and proving their concepts. They worked so hard over lockdown - we are really proud of them!












SJP Alumni

Former students returned to SJP to help carry out COVID testing. The vast majority of secondary-age students took part in onsite lateral flow tests for Coronavirus in the first two weeks of their return to school. Students and staff have been given home testing kits so they can continue testing twice a week at home, before coming into school.





This coincides with NHS Test and Trace guidance. You must report your positive result to both NHS Test & Trace and to school. In addition, you should order a confirmatory PCR test if you are testing at home.


Lunch time Clubs
