SJP Experience 2022

Over the last two weeks, we have enjoyed our SJP Experience. It has been fantastic to see both students and staff working together on different activities. This year the theme focused on 'Community, Diversity, Eco'. All activities linked into these areas in many different ways. We also tried a new way of working and created groups that included students from Years 7-10, with Year 12 students joining them for the second week. This allowed students to work with new people and develop friendships within our SJP community.

Ms Smith led the Performing Arts team as they prepared for the HFCMAT Arts Festival. Students worked within drama, music and dance, developing their skills and working on performances that were showcased at the Arts Festival on Saturday 9th July. This was a fabulous day in New Brighton, where the HFCMAT community came together to celebrate the creative work of the students.

The Art and DT teams focused on creating recycled fashion, headpieces and wearable art using the Junk Kouture programme and the use of sustainable, recycled materials to create wearable fashion/Art. Some activities involved students creating diversity placards/sculptures, eco banners and community seating/props. We also had our very own master chefs baking their own biscuits and other delicious treats. Many of the finished products were on display at the Arts festival, we now have these displayed around school.

Over in Geography, our students conducted a beach clean out at West Kirby and New Brighton, they also ventured over to Hilbre Island. Students have been exploring biodiversity and the natural environment.

The Eco club members have also been working on the completion of a new environmental policy. This week they have celebrated gaining the Eco Schools Green Flag Award with merit.

Students within the Science and PE group, enjoyed participating in a range of physical, creative and STEM activities. Activities focused on creating a sustainable solution to an environmental problem that impacts upon the local community. Following this, 97 students have achieved a Crest Award for completion of particular STEM activities, an amazing achievement!

The MFL team led activities looking at diversity within languages. Students were learning about and exploring the culture of different countries. Students also ventured over to the World Museum in Liverpool as part of this work. Within our English, Maths, History and RE carousel, students participated in activities which involved exploring events that shook the world, making peace doves and angel wings, spaghetti towers, developing origami and curve stitch skills. In some activities, students worked on the theme of protest as empowerment and explored how protest is shown through different art forms such as songs, graffiti, artwork and poetry. Part of the reflective experience in RE involved celebrating diversity and reflection upon what makes them unique, whilst remembering our calling to be part of the body of Christ.

During our second week, students have spent time back within their form groups understanding more about The SJP Experience and exploring the moral values of courage, justice, honesty, integrity, humility, compassion, gratitude and respect. Students have also participated in activities that have included personal development topics and team building activities.

Aside from these fantastic activities, students have had the chance to build resilience, work with new people and focus on interactive and creative activities. The feedback from staff and students has been great and it has been lovely to see students within different year groups working together as a community. This has sometimes meant that students have had to work outside of their comfort zone, and we are proud of them for approaching the week with a positive attitude and the willingness to try new things.

SJP - A Rights Respecting School

This year, St John Plessington Catholic College was awarded the Bronze Rights Committed School Award as part of the wider UNICEF UK Rights Respecting Schools Award. The award recognises a school's achievement in putting the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child into practice within the school and beyond. The Award is based on principles of equality, dignity, respect, non-discrimination and participation which are key values we uphold here at SJP.

This means that SJP is committed to respecting and educating our young people about the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child through the work of UNICEF both within our school and globally to protect and uphold children's rights. The values of the Rights Respecting Schools Award are embedded throughout all we do here at SJP in the way we interact with one another, through our key values of Ready, Respectful and Safe but also, through our Personal Development Curriculum in PSHE and Citizenship.

The Personal Development Curriculum this year has offered pupils many opportunities to reflect on human rights and to think about how the work of different organisations, such as UNICEF and CAFOD, work to uphold the different articles within the UN Convention on the Rights of the Child. Each week in Personal Development we have shared an article of the week from UNICEF with forms. Students have completed different activities and had discussions about what that particular right means to them. We are excited to continue this journey with UNICEF next year and look forward to working towards becoming a Silver Rights Aware School.
