Science Modular Results

Congratulations to all Year 11 Science pupils. They have just received their results from June examinations (Y10). Applied Science submitted their portfolios 1 year early. Amal George was awarded a grade B for his hard work and organization. There were many more grade C's too. Separate Science students were successful with the additional, and very difficult, modules for Chemistry and Physics. Edward Smith gained maximum marks 50 out of 50 and between the 18 students, they gained 11 grade A's. Stephen Bilko has maintained his record of grade A's - clocking up 7 A*'s and 2 grade A's in Biology, Chemistry and Physics during Y10 Excellent results were also awarded to double and single award Science. Patricia Simmons has been awarded 4 x A's and 2 x B's for the modules giving her an average of a grade A overall for Y10. The results are a credit to them and the hard work that the Science department puts in to ensure everyone does their best to reach their potential. This year pupils will take a final examination in the summer and complete 1 piece of coursework.
