The English department took 200 students to watch a performance of Macbeth, at the Epstein Theatre in Liverpool.

Macbeth is a key GCSE text, that all students will study. We took students from 9,10 and 11; a very ambitious undertaking! Students were treated to a performance set in authentic period dress, with genuinely frightening witches and a humorous Porter.

Students got to see how actors used the space around them; on occasions being startled by Macbeth or some witches creeping up past them on their way to the stage.

It was great to see the text brought alive and students agreed that it led to a deeper understanding of the text.

We were particularly interested to see how the death scene at the end would be performed, which led to some interesting post-performance discussions.

Students participated in Elevate Study Sensei sessions as part of their preparation for trail exams.

The students excelled and engaged in class and learned valuable study skills.

### **Romeo & Juliet**


Year 7 students were invited to attend one of the schools within our MAT, St Joseph's Primary school for a special performance of Romeo and Juliet by Story house Live.
