Local MP visits SJP

On January 29th our Year 7's took part in their Oracy Conference Days, an important part of our commitment to developing our pupils' speaking and debating skills. The day focused around our work as a UNICEF Rights Respecting School and allowed for pupils to debate key topics that link to human rights issues around the world.

The day also involved a visit from local Labour MP Alison McGovern who spoke to the year group about her work as an MP and how oracy skills had been a key part of her political career. She also held a Q&A session with the year group in which pupils asked about political issues, ways in which oracy was a useful skill for employability and which celebrities Alison had met.

Pupils discussed human rights issues throughout the day that linked to the World Cup being held in Qatar and looked at case studies that link to the different articles within the Convention on the Rights of the Child. The day ended with pupils holding debates in form groups which were judged by our year 13 Junior Leadership Team.

Pupils had a really great day being immersed into debate and discussion and learnt a range of skills that will support them throughout their time here at SJP and in the wider world once they leave! Oracy skills are something that we continually challenge our pupils to develop in and around the College and our pupils did us really proud!

Working as a community to collect as many plastic bottles as possible, helped her to create a fully recycled coat made entirely of plastic. Her creative and innovative thinking secured her a place as a UK contestant alongside 9 other students from around the UK. Giuliana created an outstanding makeup look that complemented the theme of her outfit perfectly. On the night of the final the arena was full with an audience, the place was a buzz with excitement. We enjoyed watching all of the creative and unique garments take to the catwalk with each young person putting on a show that reflected the theme of the garment. When it came to Giuliana's turn to show off 'Lady Rose' she worked the catwalk like a professional model. It was incredible to see her so confidently modelling the garment that had taken so much work and had such a thoughtful curation.

Giuliana has gained an insight into how the world of fashion works, and was able to meet like-minded students from across the globe while competing in this exceptional competition.

Junk Kouture CEO Troy Armour claims that this competition and process is like a sport for students who love being creative. Since 2010 Junk Kouture contestants have created 15,000 distinctive designs, saved 40,000kg of waste from landfill, and amazed packed crowds at 60 sold-out arena shows. We are all so proud of what Giuliana has achieved and cannot wait to realise the creative potential of many more students at SJP.
