Young Design Technologists of the Future

Last week St John Plessington played host to St John's Juniors Year 5 pupils for a taster lesson in Design Technology. These pupils will be following their elder brothers and sisters into SJP in a couple of years time.



The pupils used CAD/CAM technology. This is using computers to design products and computer controlled machines to make the products. They were making small photo frames using acrylic and polystyrene sheet. They were learning new skills that will give them a head start when they arrive in Year 7.



In a two hour session they completed some hand finishing skills for plastics as well as learning how plastics can be shaped through heat. They all went home with a well made and professionally finished photo frame unique to them.
